### **Review of Bowden Brompton Community School**

The Department for Education conducted a detailed review of services outside mainstream education, including Bowden Brompton Community School, during Weeks 8 and 10 of this term.

Conducted by Deloitte Access Economics, the review aims to understand how these settings contribute to positive learning experiences and inclusion for children and young people.

Families, students, and staff were invited to share their experiences through interviews and surveys. This process provided valuable insights into the strengths of existing services and identified potential areas for improvement across non-mainstream educational settings.

The inquiry focused on:

- The importance of providing alternative education options.
- · Challenges in finding a school or service that meets a child's needs.
- Comparisons between different settings, where applicable.
- What is working well in current services.
- Opportunities to improve the services offered and education overall.
- · Steps for a child's future educational journey.

These discussions continue to underscore the vital role non-mainstream settings play in addressing diverse learning needs and providing tailored support. Participants highlighted the importance of flexibility, personalised approaches, and identified strong communication between our school, students, and families as key strengths.

The feedback collected will play a crucial role in shaping future improvements, ensuring all children and young people have access to the support they need to thrive in their education. Bowden Brompton Community School remains committed to collaborating with the department to implement meaningful changes that benefit our families and the wider community.

We encourage families, students, and staff to continue sharing their perspectives through the surveys linked in recent email communications. Your insights are invaluable in shaping the future of inclusive education. Thank you to everyone who participated in the review and contributed their thoughts.





### FOOD POWER OUTCOMES

It has been a busy but fun term in the Torrens Rd kitchen!

We have welcomed new chefs, Jakob and Violet, who have been incredibly enthusiastic about food and receptive to training by our more experienced chefs, Damon K and Paula. Some of the skills they have been practising include: the knife technique to julienne spring onions/cucumber strips, rolling using a sushi mat, marinating steaks, 'mise en place' for stir frying vegetables, learning the benefits of ginger, garlic, chili, lemon, sesame seeds/oil, separating egg whites, safely using the electric mixer, using piping bags to create meringue nests, coordinating timing, converting ingredient amounts, shaping gnocchi using a fork, using the Indian absorption method for making perfect rice, using a mortar and pestle to grind spices, dry-frying to release flavour for curry, using the folding and filling technique with rice paper following a video example, creating a dipping sauce, and using chopsticks to eat — to name a few!

Dishes this term have covered many cultures and cooking styles, such as Sizzling Steak, Stir Fry, Italian Gnocchi with Sugo, Meringue with Berry Compote and Whipped Cream, Coconut Sri Lankan Chicken Curry, Lemon Friands with Lemon Curd, Vietnamese Rice Paper Rolls, and Sushi and Chocolate Lava Cake. Students also get the opportunity for critical and creative thinking when creating their own dish for the Masterchef Mystery Box Challenge!




